## **ENGINEER**

Engineer Mrs. Gill reported that the Legal Council is working out payment with the contractor regarding 108 Stratford Avenue.

Engineer Mrs. Gill mentioned that two firms submitted bids for the Green Ways Mini Grant.

Engineer Mrs. Gill reported that they are finalizing plans and bid documents regarding the infiltration bed to address flooding at the end of W. Wayne Avenue and Duffy Field. Infiltration testing yielded adequate infiltration results.

## **FINANCE**

Councilwoman Smythe reported on the reserve accounts, in the General Reserve there is a balance of \$607,272.62 the Sewer Reserve has a balance of \$299,057.43 and the Police Capital Reserve has a balance of \$15,151.05.

# **PUBLIC WORKS**

Councilman Borders reported that the Borough Parks are being cleaned up for the upcoming season.

Councilman Borders noted that the Borough was seeking interested residents to help develop a comprehensive plan for the use and development of borough owned parks, open space, and conservation areas.

Councilman Borders reminded residents if they see a depression in the street to contact the Borough so that it can be checked out.

Councilman Borders reminded residents to check their sump pumps to make sure they are draining properly into their lawns and not into the street or sewers.

Councilman Borders asked residents to be mindful to keep curb lines free of grass clippings, leaves and debris that can clog up the storm sewer drains.

#### **PUBLIC HEALTH**

Councilwoman McKernan reported the trash total for the month of March, trash 124.77 tons and the recycling, 3.10 tons.

Councilwoman McKernan reported that the Aldan Swim Club Annual Creek Clean Up resulted in twelve bags of trash, car battery and car tire.

Councilwoman McKernan mentioned that on Saturday, April 22, 2023, there will be a Delaware County Hazardous Waste Event at the Sharon Hill Emergency Services Training Center, 1600 Calcon Hook Rd., Sharon Hill, PA 19079. You can register at delcohhw.eventbrite.com or you can call the County, appointments are necessary.

Councilwoman McKernan reminded residents that we are having an E-Cycling Event and a Drug Take Back Event on Saturday, April 22, 2023, in the Aldan Borough Municipal Parking Lot between the hours of 10 AM to 2 PM.

# **HIGHWAY**

Councilman Walker reported that there were two bids received for the DELCO Green Ways Mini Grant proposal, HRG and Omnis.

Councilman Walker gave an update on the closure of Shisler Avenue Saturday, April 22, 2023, during the Aldan Youth Club parade for opening day between 8 AM to 10 AM.

## **PUBLIC SAFETY**

Councilwoman Lambert reported the Fire Marshal's report for the month of March, Collingdale Fire Company #33 and Clifton Fire Company #03 responded to seven calls within the borough all resulting with no damages. During the month of March, Collingdale ambulance and various EMS units responded to 25 calls within the borough.

Councilwoman Lambert read the report from our Police Chief regarding calls that our Police Department responded to during the month of March. There were a total of 236 incidents handled by the Aldan Police Department.

### LAW, ORDINANCE COMMITTEE

Councilwoman Blunt reported during the month of March we reviewed 52 permits. We approved 46 permits with fees totaling \$10,095.00. We provided 50 site inspections ranging from concrete pre-pours to final inspections for occupancy. We performed 3 transfer inspections, 2 sale re-inspections and 44 rental inspections.
